### Door County Medical Center Auxiliary Fulfills \$250,000 Pledge

When the Door County Medical Center proposed a new state-of-theart skilled nursing facility in 2018,

the DCMC Auxiliary stepped forward to make a bold pledge of \$250,000 over five years.

> That pledge was fulfilled on Sept. 13 when a \$45,000 check was presented to Brian Stephens, DCMC President and CEO, at the Auxiliary's annual luncheon.

"The pledge was primarily met from the proceeds of our annual House & Garden Walk and the Auxiliary Gift Shop," said Maribeth Hetherington. "Having the privilege of serving as Auxiliary president as we worked on

this commitment, I was especially delighted to complete the pledge ahead of schedule."

"A commitment that large required

a tremendous amount of volunteer hours in multiple House & Garden Walks," Stephens said. "That they met their goal and paid off the pledge in four years—despite weathering a global pandemic—speaks to the tireless commitment of our volunteers."

"This was a huge undertaking for a committee of dedicated volunteers," said Wendy Walker, co-chair of the 2021 House & Garden Walk.

"I followed in the footsteps of Gloria Heck, who masterminded the entire project plan and served as committee chair. We were well on our way by the time Chris Darling and I took the reins in 2021."

Now that the pledge has been fulfilled, future House & Garden Walk and Gift Shop proceeds will go toward the DCMC's initiative to provide enhanced behavioral health services to the communities it serves.
