

### Door County Medical Center Birthing Center - A Critical, Mission-Driven Need

Across the country rural hospitals are shuttering their obstetrics units due to financial pressures, workforce shortages, and declining birth rates.

When a rural birthing center closes, a community faces increased travel time for care, increased infant and maternal mortality rates, worse outcomes for vulnerable populations and a widening of existing health disparities.

Pause for a moment to consider what it may mean to an expectant new family to travel from Sister Bay to Green Bay (76 miles!) in early February with an impending ice or snow storm when a mother goes into labor.

The Door County Medical Center (DCMC) Birthing Center is not impervious to the threat of closure. On average, 123 babies are born at DCMC every year. On average,

the cost to deliver a healthy baby is about \$30,000. Medicare, Medicaid and even private insurance does not reimburse at a high enough rate to cover that cost.

Despite the economic issues that DCMC's Birthing Center faces, DCMC and the DCMC Foundation are dedicated to keeping state-of-the-art, safe and accessible maternity care in our community.

With this in mind, the DCMC Foundation is establishing the DCMC Birthing Center Fund. We know that with the help of this incredible community we can ensure that residents of Door County can safely deliver their babies with the help of the caring staff at Door County Medical Center now, and well into the future.

## Behavioral Health Resources Expand

Over the past two years, the DCMC Foundation has raised \$4.5M to expand Behavioral Health resources and clear the blocks for individuals seeking treatment.

Our goals have been to expand services to all schools and clinics, expand Senior Life Solutions, expand Substance Use Disorder (SUD) services, increase availability of Psychiatric and Psychological services and increase the acceptability of behavioral health treatment.

#### Here's how we are stacking up:

- Behavioral Health presence in schools increased from 7 hours to 28 hours, weekly
- Expanded space for Senior Life Solutions
- Obtained state certification to treat SUD in an outpatient setting
- Added a full-time psychiatrist
- Added four additional Behavioral Health specialists, totalling eight full-time therapists
- Increased patient visits from 6,800 to 8,900, annually

While the work will continue, we want to celebrate everyone who has contributed to date. In just two years since the need was clearly identified, a plan of action was put into place, our community stepped up and incredible progress has been made toward meeting that need.



# Celebrating 20 Years of the David Spude Cancer Center Fund

David Spude was a devoted husband and father who was respected by all who knew him. Sadly, David died of cancer in June of 2004.

His employer, the Doerr family, trusted and depended on him as their "right hand man" as they developed their motor plants throughout Wisconsin. As a tribute to David, his wife Lois, the Doerr family and the Door County Medical Center Foundation established the David Spude Cancer Center Fund to perpetually benefit the Door County Cancer Center facility.

Over \$600,000 has been raised since the fund's inception in 2005. Funds are consistently allocated to update the single occupancy chemotherapy treatment rooms with the latest equipment and furnishings. The fund ensures that a full range of cancer diagnostic and treatment equipment is available close to home in the most comforting and peaceful environment possible.

Since 2005, the David Spude Cancer Center Fund has provided televisions for patient rooms, new furniture in the waiting area, chemotherapy treatment chairs, laptop computers and iPads as well as new chemotherapy pumps, a colonoscopy system upgrade and a CT scanner. We invite you to support the David Spude Cancer Center Fund and this very vital medical facility in Door County.
